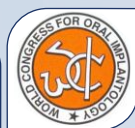

5. Define each abbreviation the first time it is used in the text by placing in parentheses.
6. Do not include references in the abstract.
7. Submitted abstracts should be unpublished and have not been presented before.

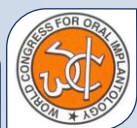

POSTER PRESENTATION

GUIDELINES:

- Registration for conference is compulsory for poster presentation.
- Abstract should be submitted through online abstract submission system/or as a hard copy along with the CD of the abstract. Please follow the instructions therein.
- A Panel of 3ft (Width) x 5ft (height) will be provided for each poster presentation. Poster of sizes in excess of these dimensions may not be permitted to be displayed.
- Each poster will be allotted a number which will be displayed on the poster boards. The author will fix the poster at their specified place only.
- Arrangements to fix posters must be made by the presenters on their own by using double sticking material; gum/plaster etc. will not be allowed.
- Use good quality poster, should be of one sheet, be digitally printed and laminated.
- Avoid using plain paper and also sticking multiple A4 size sheets for poster.
- Mention the name and address with email of the presenting author at bottom left of the poster in capital letters.
- Presenting author will be required to be presented at a specified time (will be intimated later) by the poster side for discussion with judges for best poster award.

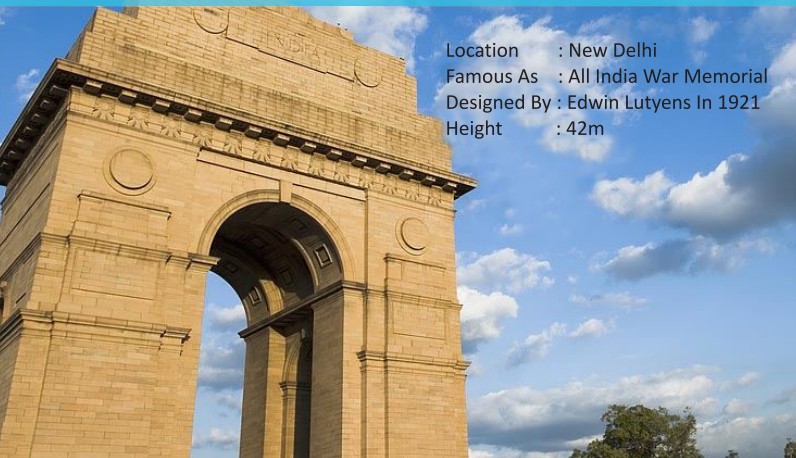
HOST CITY- DELHI

CAPITAL	New Delhi
LANGUAGES	India has 15 official languages. Although HINDI is the official language, English enjoys associate status & is widely spoken & written all across the country .
TIME ZONE	Despite its size , India has a single time zone . It is 2-1/2 hr behind Hong Kong and Singapore , 5-1/2 hrs ahead of London (GMT), 10-1/2 hrs ahead of New York & 13-1/2 hrs ahead of San-Francisco .
TIME DIFFERENCE	India is in Southern Asia, bordering the Arabian Sea and the Bay of Bengal, between Burma and Pakistan. India operates 5 Hours 30 minutes ahead of Greenwich Mean Time.
WEATHER & CLIMATE	India has hot tropical weather with variations occurring region to region. While the coolest months are - November to mid-March, Winters in India are pleasant.
CURRENCY & BANKING	It is advised to convert required amount of money into Indian Rupees through authorized foreign exchange dealers only, and obtain a receipt for all such transactions. This receipt enables repatriation of any unspent Indian money into foreign currency. The currency is Rupee. 1 Rupee = 100 Paisa. All major credit cards such as American Express, Bank of America, Diners, MasterCard, Visa and affiliates are accepted in most places in India. Automatic Teller Machines (ATMs) offer a complete 24-hour service. Most commercial banks are open - 0900 hrs to 1530 on Mondays to Fridays and - 0900 hrs to 1300 hrs on Saturday.
VISAS	All foreigners , with the exception of nationals of Nepal and Bhutan , must have a valid passport (min 6 months) & visa to enter.
TRANSPORT	Indian Airlines has the widest domestic airline network & operates regular flights to all important places . Private airlines such as JET , SAHARA , KINGFISHER & Air Deccan also operate regular flights on trunk routes. India also has the largest network of Railways & luxury BUS service connecting important cities in INDIA.

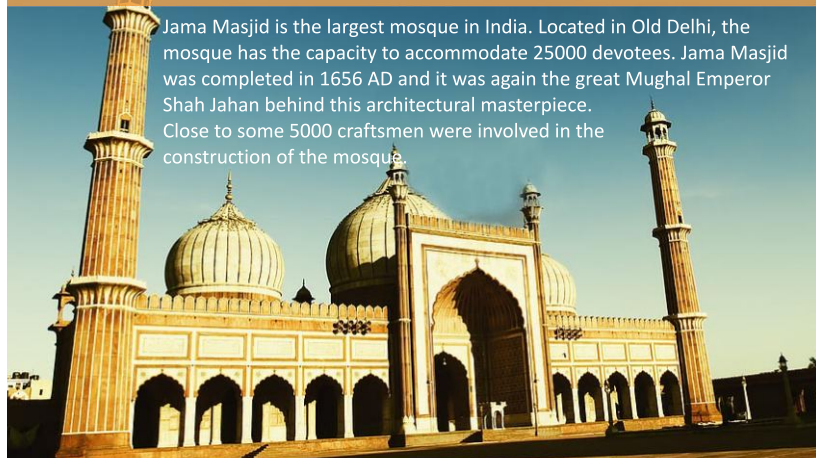

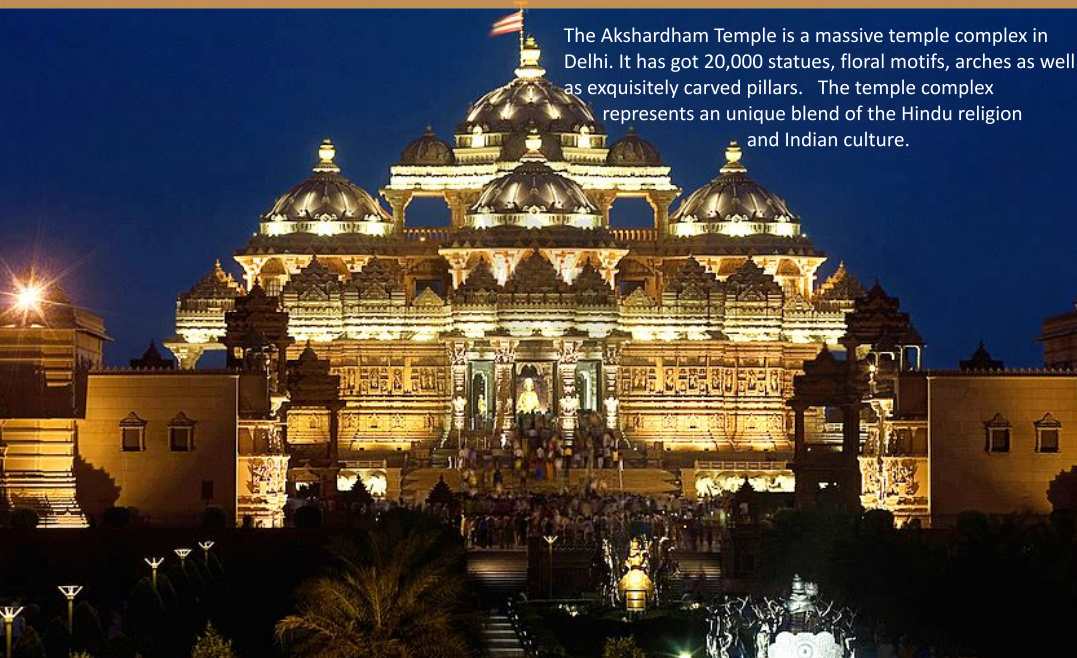
JAMA MASJID

Jama Masjid is the largest mosque in India. Located in Old Delhi, the mosque has the capacity to accommodate 25000 devotees. Jama Masjid was completed in 1656 AD and it was again the great Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan behind this architectural masterpiece. Close to some 5000 craftsmen were involved in the construction of the mosque.



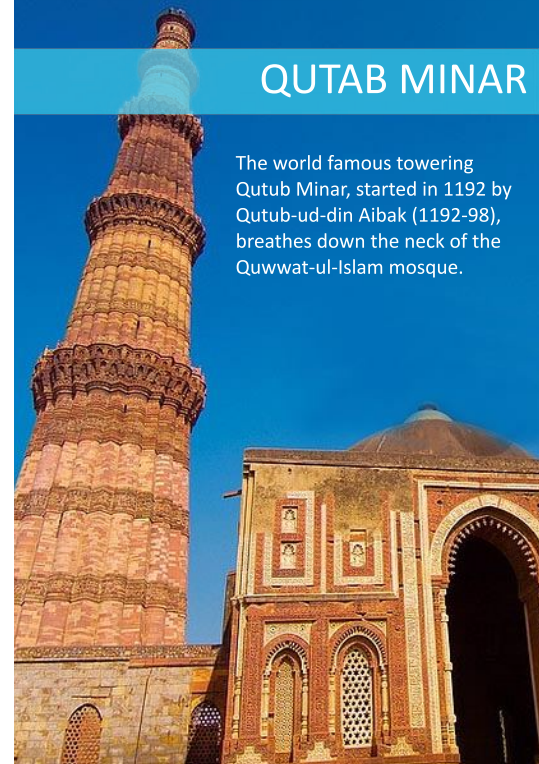
AKSHARDHAM

The Akshardham Temple is a massive temple complex in Delhi. It has got 20,000 statues, floral motifs, arches as well as exquisitely carved pillars. The temple complex represents an unique blend of the Hindu religion and Indian culture.



QUTAB MINAR

The world famous towering Qutub Minar, started in 1192 by Qutub-ud-din Aibak (1192-98), breathes down the neck of the Quwwat-ul-Islam mosque.



LOTUS TEMPLE



Lotus Temple - a modern of Delhi is one such temple that facilitates the Bhai's Faith of Worship. The Baha'i House of Worship is dedicated to the oneness of all religions and mankind. Subsidiary buildings that afford relief to the suffering, sustenance to the poor, shelter to the wayfarer, solace to the bereaved and education to the ignorant will abound around the House of Worship.

RED FORT

Built during the reign of Shah Jahan, the Lal Qila (or Red Fort) has been a mute witness to innumerable conspiracies, scandals, battles..... Completed in a span of nine years, it cost about ten million rupees , with about half the sum going towards the building of palaces.

The Red Fort is an intimidating structure. It measures 900m by 550m, with its rampart walls covering a perimeter of 2.41km. It towers at a height of 33.5m.
